Families are advised the following school fees for 2015 will apply. These fees have been recommended by the CEC Finance, Facilities & Resources Committee and endorsed by the Bishop. If the level of increase creates any hardship for you please make an appointment with the Principal to discuss the circumstances.

 1^{st} Child \$274.25 + levies = \$405.25 per term
