We will be running a Mother's Day Stall on Friday where students are able to buy Mother's day gifts ranging from \$1 - \$5. Each class will have an opportunity to purchase items. Last week we heard the news of the devastating earthquake that struck Nepal. Sadly reports continue to describe the extent of the destruction and the loss of life. As a community we have offered our prayers for the people of Nepal. As a school community we will be holding a "Casual Clothes Day" on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> May to assist in raising funds that can be sent to Nepal. The funds will be forwarded to Caritas. Students are asked to bring along a gold coin donation.

Next week students from Years 3 and 5 will be participating in NAPLAN (National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy) is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. NAPLAN has been undertaken in all schools since 2008 across Australia. Testing takes place from Tuesday 12th-Thursday 14th May. NAPLAN is made up of tests in the four domains of Reading, Writing, Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and Numeracy. NAPLAN assesses skills in literacy and numeracy that are developed over time, through the school curriculum. The NAPLAN information is used in conjunction with school based assessments across all learning areas to get a picture of each student's achievement and progress and to help us in planning teaching and learning programs.

At the completion of testing an individual student NAPLAN report will be issued by the school during Term 3. Parents are encouraged to use this information to monitor how their child is progressing and to identify any areas of concern. Parents may also wish to use their child's results to discuss progress with teachers.

School photos will be taken on Friday, 29th May. All students are required to wear full school uniform on that day including black shoes. Photo payments can be made online, through the school phone app or order forms can be collected and dropped off at the front office. A timetable is also included in the newsletter.



#### NAPLAN TEST DATES 2015

#### Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> May

Language Conventions – 40 minutes Years 3 & 5 Writing – 40 minutes – Years 3 & 5 (Narrative or Persuasive) Wednesday 13th May Reading - 45 minutes Year 3 and 50 minutes Year 5 Thursday 14<sup>h</sup> May

#### Handy tips for parents to assist in their child's preparation:

- Take the time to speak with your child about NAPLAN tests. Reassure your child that this is only one form of assessment that teachers use throughout the year.
- Online NAPLAN Practice Tests covering areas of Numeracy, Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation can be accessed on www.smeebu.com These assessments are designed to help build familiarity with the NAPLAN test format, they're also fun to do.
- Sample questions and example test booklets can be accessed on the NAMPLAN website: www.nap.edu.au/ naplan/the-tests.html
- Speak with your child's classroom teacher for further information or clarification of tests as required.

#### Numeracy Plan of Attack – Strategies for answering test <u>questions</u>

- Read the problem carefully
- Underline/circle/highlight key words or phrases in the question
- Understand what information is required; use scrap paper for working out
- Choose and use the best problem solving strategies to find the answer
- Use specific techniques for answering different types of questions as shown for multiple choice, short answer and calculator question

#### Reading - Plan of Attack to incorporate the reading strategies

- Read the title and examine the illustrations. •
- Note the text layout. •
- Identify key points to summarise.
- Read the questions.
- Go back and read through the text.
- Interpret new words by using context clues.
- Understand that the texts may include names of places and people that are unfamiliar, and to read on rather than deliberate over the pronunciation of such names.

#### Specific techniques for answering questions

- Read the entire question carefully.
- Re-read and carefully underline/circle/highlight key words or the main phrase in the question.
- Understand what information is required.
- Refer back to the text to clarify information.

Write key words in margin of text to summarise each paragraph
