

FOR ALL FUTURE GENERATIONS


This week in Project Compassion we meet Leaia. Leaia lives with her five children, husband, brother, and sister-in-law on the island of Upolu in Samoa. Not having access to clean water for their daily lives has caused Leaia a lot of worry. Samoa may be a country surrounded by water, but access to clean drinking water is scarce in some areas, with many families facing extreme hardship as a result. Leaia's family built the home entirely out of recycled scraps collected from a nearby recycling plant, as not to waste precious income and provide for her children.

Their home is not connected to a piped water system, so they used to rely solely on rainwater collected in old fridges. When their water ran out, she had to walk with her young children to collect water in buckets and containers from a neighbour down the street.

OSHC REGISTRATION FORM, 2024

A reminder to families that OSHC Bookings for 2023 have not been carried over to 2024.

If your child requires OSHC services this year, the 2024 OSHC Form is now available. You can collect a form from the front office or you can download one from the school website: OSHC Enrolment Form, 2024

We recommend that all families complete the form even if you do not usually use the service so your child can be have supervised care in case of an emergency or unforeseen circumstance.

OSHC BOOKINGS, CANCELLATIONS, CHARGES & CHANGES

- Cancellations or bookings must be made in writing at least 24 hours in advance for a normal rate of \$35 to apply and for cancellations not to be charged (Before 2:30pm for ASC and before 7am for BSC the day prior of booking or required booking). **Bookings made less than 24 hours in advance will be charged \$45 per child**.
- If you have booked your child in for OSHC but decide to collect your child from school, or allow them to walk or ride home, we need you to notify the OSHC team before 2pm on the day of your booking.
- Vacation Care enrolment forms received after the submission date will incur an additional cost of \$50 per child.
- Vacation Care requires 48 hours (before 7am, two days prior) in advance written notification for cancellations.
- All bookings and cancellations must be in writing and made through operoo /website. Email accepted, please email: oshc.hs@nt.catholic.edu.au
- A \$50 late fee (plus \$1 per minute) per child will apply if your child is collected after 5:30pm.
- As per the Terms and Conditions on the OSHC enrolment form, public holidays will be charged if the front office has not received a cancellation of booking for that date.
- Students who have not been collected by 2:45pm will be sent to OSHC to ensure supervision. Once a child is signed in at OSHC the casual rate will be charged.
- Emergency contacts and people approved for collection of children must show identification when collecting students from OSHC and be of at least 18 years of age.

VACATION CARE - APRIL

The Vacation Care form is available on Operoo and the school website: <u>April Vacation Care form</u>. Please note any forms received after 3pm, Wednesday, 20 of March will incur the late submission fee. Your child must be registered at OSHC to use this service.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Regular school attendance is very important for all our children. Every day at school counts! Please refer to the table below as an indicator of how repeated absences can have an impact on student learning.

Your child's attendance is above 95%
They are likely to be a 'Star Performer' as well as an excellent attendee. They will almost certainly achieve the
best grades for their ability and have real opportunity in further education, or in the world of work.
Your child's attendance is 90 – 94%
'GREEN for Go' for good attendance, they are likely to achieve grades that will give them real
opportunities to continue their studies, or in the world of work.
10 days missed = 2 weeks absence
Your child's attendance is 85 – 89%
'AMBER – Take care' as students will be missing up to 20 days each year and this will make it very difficult for
them to achieve their best.
Your child's attendance is 80 – 84%
'RED light – Be alert' as students are missing so much school that it will be very difficult for them to keep in
touch with lessons or with work.
Your child's attendance is below 80%
'AT RISK – Immediate Action Needed' as students are missing so much time from school that it will be
almost impossible for them to keep in touch with lessons or work.

Please do not park on the yellow lines outside the front office entrance.
This area is monitored and you may be fined.

Reward Afternoon (Weeks 5 and 10 of each term)

Reward Afternoon takes place on Friday of Weeks 5 and 10 of each term. Our students are rewarded for positive behaviour in both the class-room and playground. Positive behaviour identified and recognised by staff for students supporting our <u>Positive School Support Policy and Agreed Practices</u> will participate in <u>Reward Afternoon</u>.

Classroom teachers will negotiate with their class and teaching team an activity of their choice to participate during this time. Families will be informed of planned activities through *Class Dojo* or letter. Activities/lessons that can be used for *Reward Afternoon*:

- Watching a movie (G Rated)
 - ♦ Where PG, parents/carers informed of movie to be shown and written consent required)
- Organised class party
- Water play (slip and slide at school)
- Sport activity
- Technology afternoon (students invited to bring in devices from home)
 - ♦ Where electronic devices are brought into school, a reminder that students are only permitted to participate in activities as approved by their teacher during this time
- Shared activity with Buddy Class or year level group

Students who receive three <u>Red Cards</u> or more within the five weeks are not permitted to participate in <u>Reward Afternoon</u>. Where this occurs, <u>Incident Report/Red Card</u> and notification provided to families to keep all informed.

During this time student's work with Principal/Deputy Principal to complete Community Service projects around the school.

IN THE EVENT OF A CYCLONE...

As we are now in the cyclone season in the Top End, families are reminded of our school procedures in the event of a cyclone. School closures are announced by the Department of Education and are broadcast to the public on the local TV and radio stations.

In the event that

government schools are closed, Catholic schools will also be closed. Please listen to the radio or TV for updates in relation to school closures and re-opening. We will endeavour to keep families informed via our school app, class dojo and email, but this will be dependent on the availability of power and personnel.


