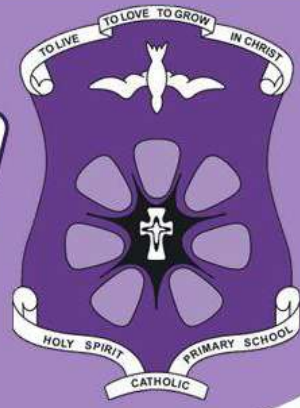

Our staff share stories and photos of children in their learning. Many of our classes have 100% of families connected which is fantastic. I'm hoping by the end of the week to have all our families connected.

We have attached the link to our [homework policy](#) as a reminder of the role that school plays and what you can do at home. For those requesting additional work for your children, we have provided some suggestions below.

- ⇒ Reading each day with books as provided by our school or from home that suit your child's needs.
- ⇒ Everyday maths skills - including mental maths, using money, reading timetables and itineraries as a few examples.
- ⇒ Complete spelling activities using words provided through homework, or words from home
 - ◇ alphabetical order, breaking into syllables, using the word in a sentence, identifying whether the word is a noun, verb, adjective or adverb
- ⇒ Revision of sight words as provided by your child's classroom teacher
- ⇒ Keeping a diary or writing emails, letters recording events and activities each day
- ⇒ Keeping a journal, written or digital, documenting reflections of their experiences
- ⇒ Complete set tasks on Study Ladder <http://www.studyladder.com.au>
- ⇒ To improve touch typing skills use Dance Mat Typing, a free online resource <https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zf2f9j6/articles/z3c6tfr>

OSHC REGISTRATION FORM, 2024

A reminder to families that OSHC Bookings for 2023 have not been carried over to 2024. If your child requires OSHC services this year, the 2024 OSHC Form is now available. You can collect a form from the front office or you can download one from the school website: [OSHC Enrolment Form, 2024](#)

We recommend that all families complete the form even if you do not usually use the service so your child can be have supervised care in case of an emergency or unforeseen circumstance.

OSHC BOOKINGS, CANCELLATIONS, CHARGES & CHANGES






- Cancellations or bookings must be made in writing at least 24 hours in advance for a normal rate of \$35 to apply and for cancellations not to be charged (Before 2:30pm for ASC and before 7am for BSC the day prior of booking or required booking). **Bookings made less than 24 hours in advance will be charged \$45 per child.**
- If you have booked your child in for OSHC but decide to collect your child from school, or allow them to walk or ride home, we need you to notify the OSHC team before 2pm on the day of your booking.
- Vacation Care enrolment forms received after the submission date will incur an additional cost of \$50 per child.
- Vacation Care requires 48 hours (before 7am, two days prior) in advance written notification for cancellations.
- All bookings and cancellations must be in writing and made through operoo /website. Email accepted, please email: oshc.hs@nt.catholic.edu.au
- A \$50 late fee (plus \$1 per minute) per child will apply if your child is collected after 5:30pm.
- As per the Terms and Conditions on the OSHC enrolment form, public holidays will be charged if the front office has not received a cancellation of booking for that date.
- Students who have not been collected by 2:45pm will be sent to OSHC to ensure supervision. Once a child is signed in at OSHC the casual rate will be charged.
- Emergency contacts and people approved for collection of children must show identification when collecting students from OSHC and be of at least 18 years of age.

VACATION CARE – APRIL

The *Vacation Care* form is available on Operoo and the school website: [April Vacation Care form](#) . Please note any forms received after 3pm, Wednesday, 20 of March will incur the late submission fee. Your child must be registered at OSHC to use this service.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Regular school attendance is very important for all our children. Every day at school counts! Please refer to the table below as an indicator of how repeated absences can have an impact on student learning.

	Your child’s attendance is above 95% They are likely to be a ‘Star Performer’ as well as an excellent attendee. They will almost certainly achieve the best grades for their ability and have real opportunity in further education, or in the world of work.
	Your child’s attendance is 90 – 94% ‘GREEN for Go’ for good attendance, they are likely to achieve grades that will give them real opportunities to continue their studies, or in the world of work.
10 days missed = 2 weeks absence	
	Your child’s attendance is 85 – 89% ‘AMBER – Take care’ as students will be missing up to 20 days each year and this will make it very difficult for them to achieve their best.
	Your child’s attendance is 80 – 84% ‘RED light – Be alert’ as students are missing so much school that it will be very difficult for them to keep in touch with lessons or with work.
	Your child’s attendance is below 80% ‘AT RISK – Immediate Action Needed’ as students are missing so much time from school that it will be almost impossible for them to keep in touch with lessons or work.

Please do not park on the yellow lines outside the front office entrance. This area is monitored and you may be fined.

PASTORAL CARE AND WELLBEING

BLUE BUDDY CARD

Blue Buddy Card is a process/procedure in place for all classroom/specialist teachers to utilise when a student requires some reflection time away from their class. Where a student receives a Blue Buddy Card, they are sent to their identified buddy class. For students receiving a Blue Buddy Card a down Class Dojo may be recorded. Through Blue Buddy Card students are provided:

- 5- 15 minutes cool down time
- An opportunity to complete their schoolwork.
- Time to complete Reflection Sheet

Blue Buddy Card is not available during Homework Centre (HWC) or Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) as these sessions take place before and after school hours. Where a student is required to have some time to reflect on behavioural choices; supervisors from centre/s will provide the time and space for students to sit and reflect on their choices. Supervisors from respective centres will keep parents/carers informed of this as the need arises.

BYODD PROGRAMME – BRING YOUR OWN DESIGNATED DEVICE

The school laptop device programme is for students in years 3-6. Only devices ordered through *Edunet* are permitted at school. Students are not able to bring in their own devices from home as these are not connected to our school network.

This laptop device programme is an ICT solution where families purchase a designated (purchased through Edunet portal) personal technology device for students to use in their day-to-day classwork and to take home. The type of devices on the school portal are carefully selected by Holy Spirit Catholic Primary School, in consultation with NT Schools, Edunet and Area 9 and is a device which is compatible with the NT Schools Network.

PARENT PICK UP & DROP OFF AREA

We have been experiencing a number of traffic flow issues with our *Parent Pick Up and Drop off* area at afternoon dismissal. These issues are currently leading to traffic congestion on Gsell street, traffic jams in the *Parent Pick Up* area and dangerous collection of students.

In order to assist with overcoming these issues you can help in the following ways:

- Do not park in front of the school automatic gate prior to the opening of the gates of an afternoon.
- Do not park your car in the *parent pick up* area and leave your vehicle there.
- Do not park or sit idle on the road that runs through our parent pick up area
- If you cannot see your child, please drive through to make another pass, do not wait in the parking bay for your child to arrive.
- If all the waiting bays are full please drive through and park in the visitor car park or drive around again.
