Today was our first day of NAPLAN with our Year 3 and 5 students sitting their Writing test. NAPLAN continues over the next few weekss with students competing tests in the area of Reading, Language Conventions and Numeracy. Thank you to all our teachers for their work and preparation for NAPLAN this year. We have allocated catch up sessions for those students absent to ensure they are able to participate. Please take the time to speak with your child about NAPLAN and how they feel they are going. Please reassure your child that NAPLAN is one test on a particular day, and it is only one form of assessment that we use throughout the year when collecting data. Results of NAPLAN do not influence results in literacy and numeracy as we continue to conduct ongoing assessment throughout our school year to gain this valuable data.

Regular school attendance is very important for all children. Every day at school counts! Please refer to the table as an indicator of how repeated absences can have an impact on student learning.

Your child's attendance is above 95% They are likely to be a 'Star Performer' as well as an excellent attendee. They will almost certainly achieve the best grades for their ability and have real opportunity in further education, or in the world of work.
Your child's attendance is 90 – 94% 'GREEN for Go' for good attendance, they are likely to achieve grades that will give them real opportunities to continue their studies, or in the world of work.
10 days missed = 2 weeks absence
Your child's attendance is 85 – 89% 'AMBER – Take care' as students will be missing up to 20 days each year and this will make it very difficult for them to achieve their best.
Your child's attendance is 80 – 84% 'RED light – Be alert' as students are missing so much school that it will be very difficult for them to keep in touch with lessons or with work.
Your child's attendance is below 80% 'AT RISK – Immediate Action Needed' as students are missing so much time from school that it will be almost impossible for them to keep in touch with lessons or work.

A reminder to our families around safety during afternoon dismissal, especially along Gsell Street. On arrival in the afternoon, where gate is closed, do not remain idle awaiting gate to open. Please follow road safety laws and proceed to the car park. Your compliance and support required. The safety of not only our students and staff, but also members of the public is at risk where you are not following the road safety laws. I am available to meet with you if you wish to discuss.



CHILD SAFETY AND WELLBEING

- Parents are reminded that **staff supervision** commences at 7:45am each morning prior to school commencing at 8:10am. Parents who require care before this time are asked to book their child into the 'Before School Care Programme' at a cost of \$75/week or \$15 per day.
- Parent pick up— Parents are reminded that the *Parent pick up* is for a drop off in the morning and collection in the afternoon. It is not a designated parking area.
- Please do not park on the yellow lines outside the front office entrance. This area is monitored and you may be fined.

OSHC REGISTRATION FORM, 2024

A reminder to families that OSHC Bookings for 2023 have not been carried over to 2024.

If your child requires OSHC services this year, the 2024 OSHC Form is now available. You can collect a form from the front office or you can download one from the school website: OSHC Enrolment Form, 2024

We recommend that all families complete the form even if you do not usually use the service so your child can be have supervised care in case of an emergency or unforeseen circumstance.

OSHC BOOKINGS, CANCELLATIONS, CHARGES & CHANGES

- Cancellations or bookings must be made in writing at least 24 hours in advance for a normal rate of \$35 to apply and for cancellations not to be charged (Before 2:30pm for ASC and before 7am for BSC the day prior of booking or required booking). **Bookings made less than 24 hours in advance will be charged \$45 per child**.
- If you have booked your child in for OSHC but decide to collect your child from school, or allow them to walk or ride home, we need you to notify the OSHC team before 2pm on the day of your booking.
- Vacation Care enrolment forms received after the submission date will incur an additional cost of \$50 per child.
- Vacation Care requires 48 hours (before 7am, two days prior) in advance written notification for cancellations.
- All bookings and cancellations must be in writing and made through operoo /website. Email accepted, please email: oshc.hs@nt.catholic.edu.au
- A \$50 late fee (plus \$1 per minute) per child will apply if your child is collected after 5:30pm.
- As per the Terms and Conditions on the OSHC enrolment form, public holidays will be charged if the front office has not received a cancellation of booking for that date.
- Students who have not been collected by 2:45pm will be sent to OSHC to ensure supervision. Once a child is signed in at OSHC the casual rate will be charged.
- Emergency contacts and people approved for collection of children must show identification when collecting students from OSHC and be of at least 18 years of age.

VACATION CARE - APRIL

The Vacation Care form is available on Operoo and the school website: <u>April Vacation Care form</u>. Please note any forms received after 3pm, Wednesday, 20 of March will incur the late submission fee. Your child must be registered at OSHC to use this service.

REFLECTION SHEET

There may be occasions during learning time, in the playground, Homework Centre (HWC) or Out School Hours Care (OSHC) that your child may be asked to complete a Reflection Sheet. This is an opportunity for your child to have some quiet time to record in their words what has occurred.

The Reflection Sheet has three main questions:

- What happened?
- What would have been a better choice? Who have you upset?
- What can I do now to make things right?

A record of this is kept on file at school, and depending on nature of incident, may be sent home for parent/carers signature as well as acknowledgement of receipt.

This reflection sheet may be used where a student is sent to their Buddy Class for a short break or where the behaviour exhibited does not support our Positive Behaviour Support Policy and Agreed Practices.

Where students are required to complete Reflection Sheet at HWC/OSHC, they will be given time to sit with supervisors in a quiet space as provided by centre. Procedures following this remain the same for students during recess/lunch or learning time during school hours. We encourage parent/carers to contact staff to clarify or discuss as required. Copies of all policies and procedures are available to all parents/carers upon request.

IN THE EVENT OF A CYCLONE...

As we are now in the cyclone season in the Top End, families are reminded of our school procedures in the event of a cyclone. School closures are announced by the Department of Education and are broadcast to the public on the local TV and radio stations.

In the event that

government schools are closed, Catholic schools will also be closed. Please listen to the radio or TV for updates in relation to school closures and re-opening. We will endeavour to keep families informed via our school app, class dojo and email, but this will be dependent on the availability of power and personnel.

Leaving?

If your child is leaving the school, please notify the office in writing (email accepted) or by completing a '<u>Termination of Enrolment'</u> form on Operoo

Late?

If your child arrives to school after the first bell (8:10am), please send them to the front office to be signed in. If they are not signed in they will be recorded as an unexplained absence.

Sick?

If your child is sick please notify the front office by e-mail, phone, operoo or the school website. Your child's absence will only be recorded as a notified absence if you advise the school on the day of absence or provide a medical certificate.



BYODD PROGRAMME - BRING YOUR OWN DESIGNATED DEVICE

The school laptop device programme is for students in years 3-6. Only devices ordered through *Edunet are permitted at school. Students are not able to bring in their own devices from home as these are not connected to our school network.*

This laptop device programme is an ICT solution where families purchase a designated (purchased through Edunet portal) personal technology device for students to use in their day-to-day classwork and to take home. The type of devices on the school portal are carefully selected by Holy Spirit Catholic Primary School, in consultation with NT Schools, Edunet and Area 9 and is a device which is compatible with the NT Schools Network.

PARENT PICK UP & DROP OFF AREA

We have been experiencing a number of traffic flow issues with our *Parent Pick Up and Drop off* area at afternoon dismissal. These issues are currently leading to traffic congestion on Gsell street, traffic jams in the *Parent Pick Up* area and dangerous collection of students.


