#### Coloured sand recall update


I am pleased to report that we have carried out all required steps following the recent recall of a range of coloured sand products. We have worked with NT Worksafe and Catholic Education NT Work, Health and Safety Manager throughout this process.

All coloured sand products which were on site at the school have been removed by a licensed asbestos contractor. We have carried out specialist cleaning and air monitoring in the rooms where recalled sand products were stored which returned negative results. All our spaces are now back in use and I would like to take the opportunity to thank everyone for their patience and understanding during this time. The safety of the children in our care is paramount and always comes first.

#### **Facility Upgrades**

Our toilet upgrades are now nearing completion. We extend a sincere thank you to Asset Construction for their hard work and dedication in delivering this project. Next year, we will hold an official opening of the new bathrooms, made possible through a successful grant from the Federal Government.

Our next project will see the old shed on the oval transformed into a storage facility and an <u>open outdoor learning area</u>. We have attached the drawings for you to view. Tenders have been called, and we hope to award the contract soon. This project is scheduled to begin in the new year.



We're excited to share that an order has been submitted to upgrade all the computers in our lab! Following the Tell Them From Me survey results, we've listened to your feedback and are putting this improvement in place for next year. These new computers will provide our students with enhanced learning opportunities and a modern, engaging digital environment.
